So what happened over the last year? It's been a busy year for the Community Council and here are just a few of the matters we have been involved in:

- Finding a permanent home for the community council

- Work completed on the updating of the bus shelters located at Cylch Peris and the relocation of one of them

- We've looked at the provision of Warm Spaces and this is on-going
- Food banks
- Visits by PCSO Charlotte Carter
- Community speed watch

Organisation of the Council

Llansantffraed Community Council is the most local tier of local government for the administrative Community of Llansantffraed and is a local authority established by way of the Local Government Act 1972.

The Council comprises ten elected Members.

The Members during the 2022-23 municipal year were:

Councillors Sheila Davies, Keith Henson, Hywel Llŷr Jenkins, Lodwick Lloyd, Dennis Morgan, Andrew Phillips, Gwenno Piette and Aled Roberts (elected unopposed May 2022)

Councillors Martine Robson and Jim Rollinson (co-opted after the election).

The Council employs a part-time Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer, Mr Denfer Morgan, who is responsible for the administration of the Council, including its

finances.

The Council meets at 7:30 pm on the first Tuesday of each month at various locations during the year. The Council actively looked for locations where it could meet the provisions of the Local Government Act 2021 whereby meetings can be attended in person or by remote attendance using Zoom.

Recreational and Amenity Land

The Council owns three areas of land in the villages of Llanon and Llansantffraed which it provides for recreational and amenity purposes, namely:

- The slang with its shelter at Llansantffraed
- The children's playground at Llansantffraed
- Tennis court and multi-use games area at the Waun, Llanon.

Services

Services provided by the Council include:

- Keeping footpaths clear by way of regular strimming by a contractor
- Contributing towards the cost of cutting the playing field
- Providing play sessions by Ray Ceredigion for children during the summer holidays
- Making financial contributions to local organisations and the Llanon Village Hall

Cloncan

The Council produces a community newsletter called Cloncan which is edited by Councillors Sheila Davies and Gwenno Piette.

Finance

The Council sets an Annual Budget at its January meeting which outlines its

proposed expenditure for the following financial year in respect of the services it intends to provide and the projects it intends to undertake during the year. This expenditure is funded by way of a precept which is approved at the same meeting. The precept, in turn, is raised by way of a Council Tax payable by each dwelling within the community. Other sources of income are also used together with reserves.

The Council's budget for 2022-23, set at its Meeting held on 4th January 2022, was as follows:

Precept: £17,000 VAT Refund: £3,500 Community Grant: £7,500

Reserves: £3,000

Council Tax

A Council Tax of £30.07 was approved for Band D properties in order to produce the Precept.

Annual Accounts

The latest Annual Accounts to have been audited by Audit Wales are those for the previous financial year, 2021-22. The Council received an 'unqualified' report, with no matters requiring attention.
